OUR MISSION

Moms Against Poverty is a global 501(c)(3) non-profit organization with a mission to lessen the incidence and effects of poverty for impoverished children around the world. This is achieved through our Education, Health Care & Wellness, Hunger Relief & Basic Provisions, and Orphan Care programs, enabling children to reach their fullest potential.

With a track record dating back to 2008, Moms Against Poverty has positively impacted the lives of over 2.8 million impoverished children and families across 18 countries, driven by its core programs. Since 2010, Moms Against Poverty has held a specific license authorization from the Office of Foreign Assets Control of the United States Treasury to provide financing for charitable activities in Iran, making Moms Against Poverty uniquely situated—as a United States NGO—to address the Iranian people’s humanitarian needs. We are amongst the small number of organizations with a specific OFAC license to carry out such work in Iran.

Since 2010, we've been building educational facilities, establishing healthcare facilities, providing food and basic provisions, operating orphanages, and giving ongoing care to children in need. 16 orphanages catering to infants and toddlers nationwide supplied with food and basic needs

2,500 families, including **10,000-11,500** individuals, received food vouchers and packages

Building Dreams in a Small Village

In our small home, the kerosene heater fights the winter's cold, but its warmth can't touch the chill that's crept into our hearts. Outside, the snow covers everything in white. When my dad arrives home, his hands are freezing from the blistering wind, and my mom wraps them in her own scarf.

Dad's always talked about wanting a school in our village where I could finish high school and maybe even go to college. But he had to sell our farmland to send my brother to America for his education. Now, he toils hard every day as a laborer in nearby towns, dreaming of giving me the same chance. "Kajal," he says, "if only I had more land to sell..."

Then, one day, while weaving a carpet with our neighbor to help support our family, I heard something that made my heart leap. Our neighbor's wife mentioned seeing a sign that there was going to be a school built nearby. Could it be true? Could this finally be happening? With every knot I tied in the carpet, I prayed that it was a school for girls. You know, it is much more difficult for girls to attend school than boys here!

I ran back home, bursting with excitement as I told my Dad about the sign and begged him to find out more. When he came back with news an hour later, his eyes were shining with joy. "Kajal, my girl, you're going to school next year!" he says, hugging me tightly. In that moment, I felt like a weight had been lifted off my shoulders. And as I fell asleep that night, I felt filled with new purpose. Thank you for giving me and those like me a chance to soar!

UNITED STATES

The unfortunate reality is that millions of Americans struggle with food insecurity, even in a nation of abundance. Statistics paint a concerning picture: Feeding America estimates that nearly 1 in 5 children face hunger. This issue stems from a complex web of factors, including the lingering effects of the pandemic, limited access to health care and education, and difficulties affording nutritious food. These challenges create a barrier to a healthy life, particularly for children in marginalized communities.

Soaring food prices in 2023, fueled by supply chain issues and inflation, have pushed millions of Americans toward hunger. With crucial pandemic-era support programs ending, the safety net is weakening. Moms Against Poverty is collaborating with partners to identify gaps in existing services and working tirelessly to fill them.

Through our impactful Hunger Relief & Basic Provisions program, Moms Against Poverty connects hungry children with nutritious and healthy meals. By working closely with partners, we've successfully expanded access to high-quality nutrition for children and families in California, Virginia, Arizona, and Pennsylvania.

A Story of Family and Resilience

Iris, a mother of nine in the Bay Area, has faced the relentless challenges of making ends meet. In their small apartment, the struggle to provide enough food for the next meal was an ever-present concern, casting a shadow of worry.

When her children returned from school, the impact of having too little to eat was evident. Their hunger made participating in after-school activities nearly impossible. It distracted them from concentrating on homework and classwork. Iris expressed deep sadness at her children's suffering, and the thought that she's unable to provide enough for her family.

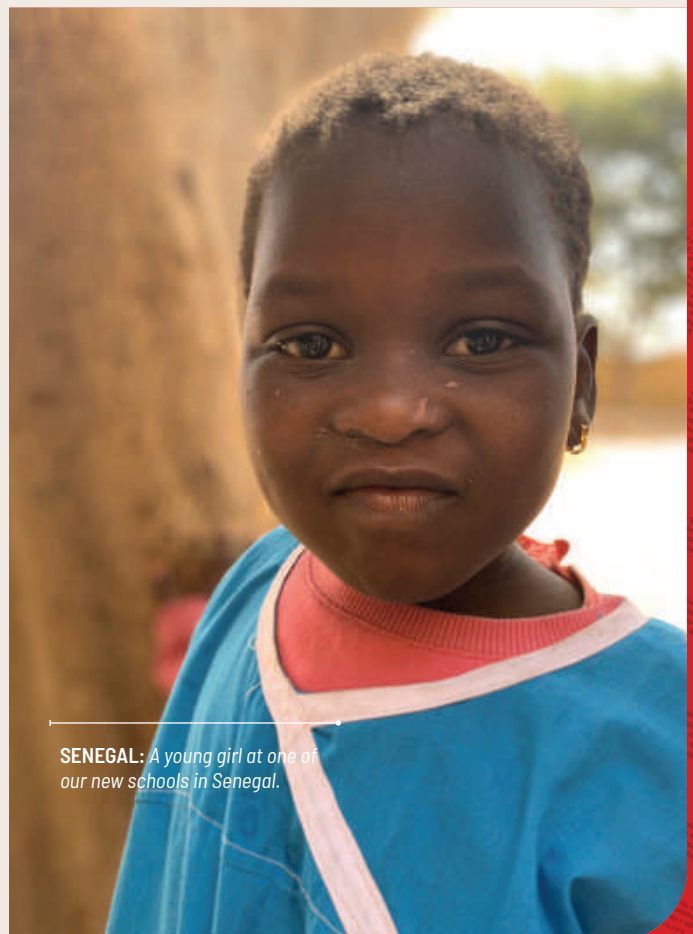
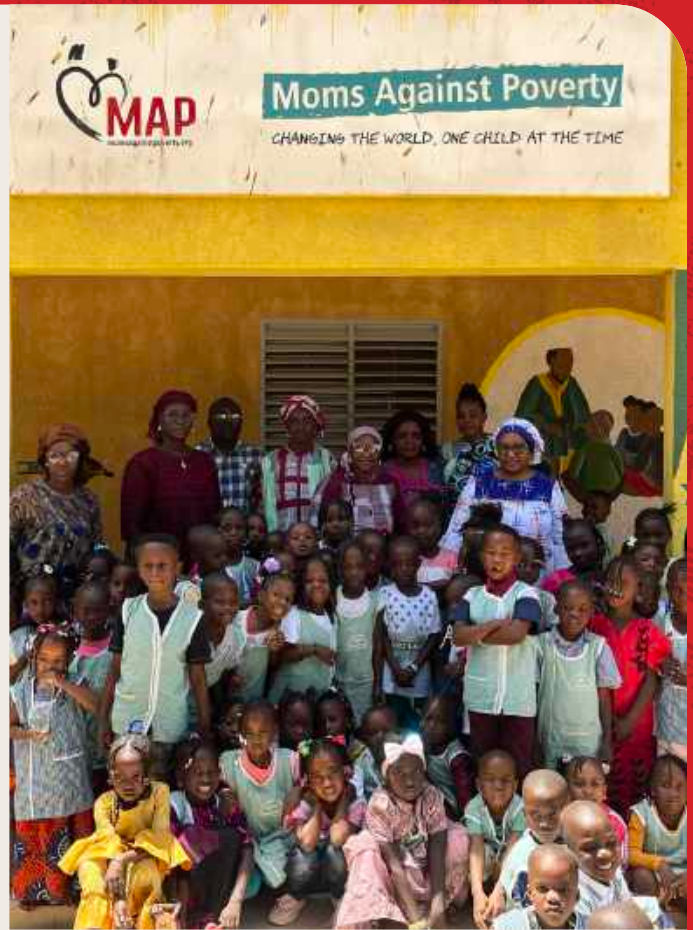

Weathering the Storm with Hope and Healing in Senegal

Khady knew that at the young age of 12, she was very lucky to attend elementary school. She was a bit older than some of her classmates since she started school late, but she was grateful to be entering the 5th grade at the Moms Against Poverty school in Mbour, Senegal.

At the end of the summer, the monsoon season begins in Senegal. Khady's family began making the necessary preparations. They built shelters for their livestock and saved up to stockpile rice, cooking oil, and spices in their home to make sure they wouldn't have to leave home in the middle of a storm. Khady's parents had lived through decades of this weather and made perfect preparations. But during one stormy afternoon, Khady began to feel ill, starting with a scratchy throat, then a headache followed by a fever.

Home remedies and pain medication didn't make a difference, and her fever wouldn't break. But with all the preparations for the monsoon, Khady's parents didn't have the resources to take her to a doctor. They started to get more worried as she became bedridden from severe body aches and wouldn't eat or drink. Searching for a solution, they reached out to Khady's elementary school principal to see if he could help.


Working with our local staff in Senegal, Khady's principal was able to enroll her in Moms Against Poverty's **Health Emergency Program, which covers students at all of our schools** in Senegal in the case of unplanned medical expenses. Our staff helped arrange her hospital intake, doctor visits, bloodwork, and examinations. They discovered that she suffered from a throat infection which was gradually spreading throughout her body, and prescribed an antibiotic treatment.

When Khady was eventually discharged from the hospital, and the city emerged from the last day of rain, it was a new day for her and her family. A few days later, it would be her first day of 5th grade at the Moms Against Poverty elementary school, and she was in great health to continue her studies, and looking forward to the year.

PHILIPPINES

In 2023, Moms Against Poverty partnered with Angel House Orphanage in the Philippines to support orphaned children by providing food, basic provisions, and access to education. This collaboration has significantly improved the lives of these children, offering them love, care, and a nurturing environment to grow and flourish.

Our efforts have resulted in happier, healthier children with renewed trust in adults and better academic performance. With fifteen children under our care, our partnership has been vital in ensuring their well-being. Looking ahead, we will focus on family reunification, increasing referrals, and expanding our programs to continue positively impacting these children's lives.

CAMPAIGNS

Moms Against Poverty engages in diverse initiatives worldwide, addressing both immediate crises and long-term projects. Each campaign, whether targeting emergency aid or sustainable development, is designed to meet the needs of affected communities. These efforts offer immediate relief, and aim to break the cycle of poverty and empower communities towards self-sufficiency.

KHOY EARTHQUAKE RELIEF FUNDRAISER

Following the destructive 5.9 magnitude earthquake in Khoy, Iran, Moms Against Poverty and Middle East Matters worked together to raise **\$68,769.04 to aid 200 families**. Thanks to compassionate donors, this response provided essential relief to survivors facing dire conditions in subzero temperatures.



EARTHQUAKE RELIEF FUNDRAISER

In the wake of the devastating 7.8 magnitude earthquake that hit Turkey and Syria on February 6th, we partnered with Child International to support the on-the-ground relief efforts. Funds raised by Moms Against Poverty were directed toward the purchase of essential supplies, including **hygiene products, bedding, baby supplies, and personal protective equipment** for affected communities.

CONSTRUCTION OF BATHROOMS FOR NOMADIC FAMILIES IN IRAN

Moms Against Poverty raised funds for the construction of **16 fully-equipped bathrooms for nomadic families** in the impoverished village of Kalateh-ye Baluch, South Khorasan Province, Iran. This **\$65,714 initiative** aimed to provide remote villagers struggling with a lack of basic facilities and increased health risks with a better and more dignified life.



BREAKFAST PROGRAM FOR NOMADIC KIDS IN IRAN

Moms Against Poverty's Breakfast Program has brought significant change to **1,380 nomadic children** in South Khorasan, Iran, by providing them with nutritious breakfasts for a year, the only meal some receive daily. Alongside the meals, children received backpacks filled with school supplies, encouraging attendance and learning.

CONSTRUCTION OF A 12-CLASSROOM SCHOOL FOR GIRLS IN IRAN

Through generous donors, Moms Against Poverty has commenced the construction of a 12-classroom school dedicated to the **education of gifted girls** in Kurdistan, Iran. This significant project aims to empower young girls by providing them with the opportunity for education and personal development.



GIVING TUESDAY: HOLIDAY HELPING HAND

Moms Against Poverty's Giving Tuesday fundraiser was dedicated to our Holiday Helping Hand Gift Wrapping & Toy Drive, aimed at raising funds for children and families in need across the Bay Area who do not have toys to open on Christmas morning. Thanks to the collective effort of the community and generous donors, we successfully provided hundreds of children with the joy of unwrapping a gift.



EVENTS

In 2023, we hosted 7 events, each contributing to our goal of combating childhood poverty. These gatherings raised critical funds and increased awareness of the urgent needs of impoverished children globally. 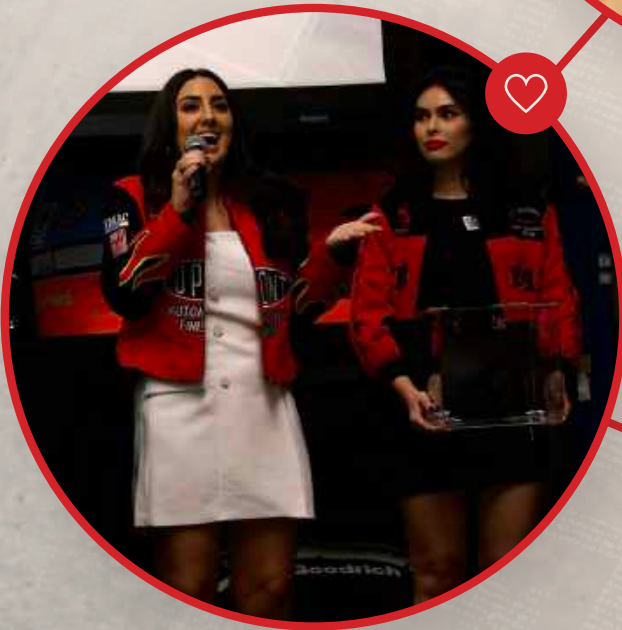

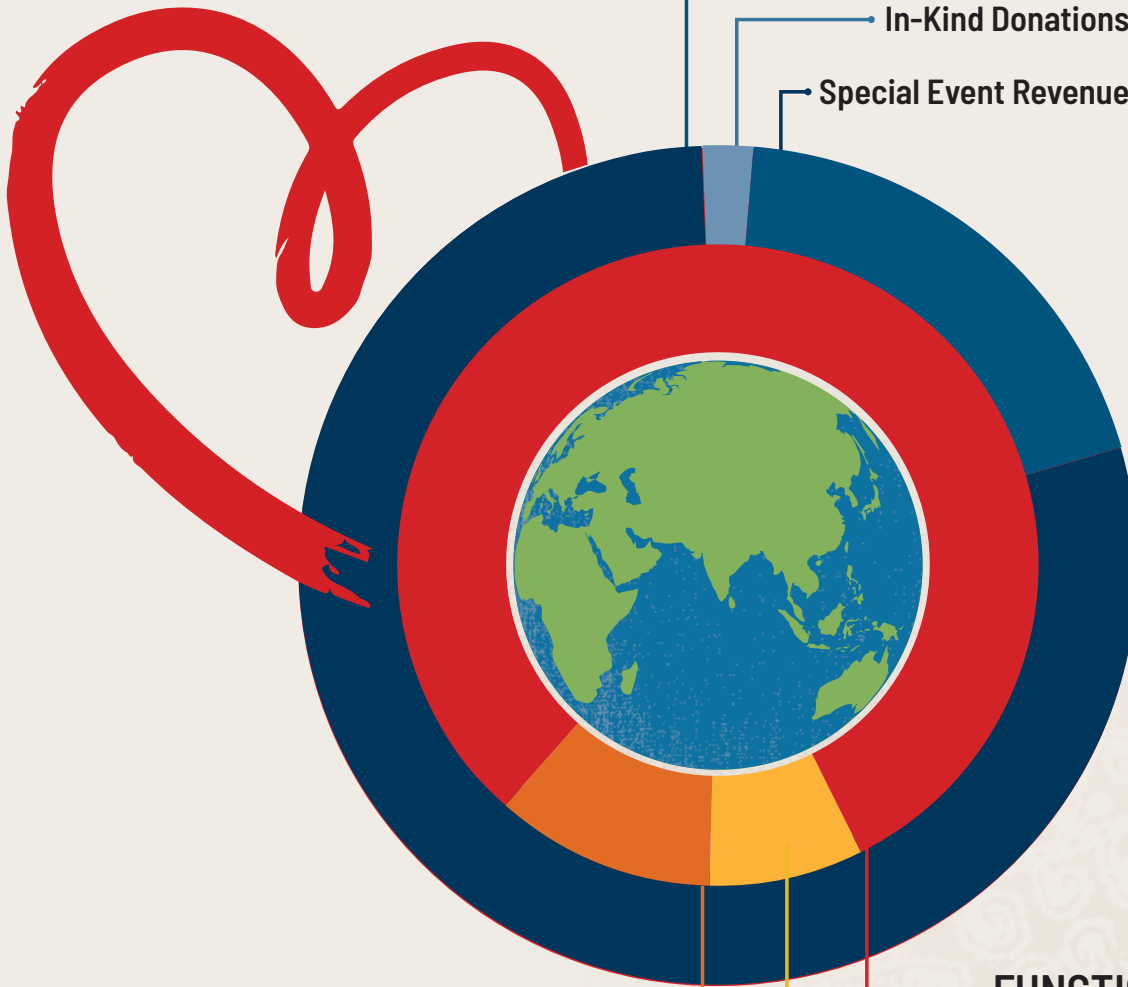
